- Copying answers or using another student's notes is cheating.
- Allowing a fellow student to copy work, notes or test answers is cheating.
- Plagiarism or cheating on ANY assignment will result in a "zero grade" on the assignment in question, as well as a referral resulting in detention and merit loss.

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Behavioral Consequences

All infractions will be entered in Jupiter Ed and generate an automatic alert to parents. Depending on the severity and/or frequency of the infraction, violating classroom rules could result in the following:

- Referral to the Vice Principal and possible Lunch Detention/After School Detention/Suspension from class

Timeliness

- Regular attendance is extremely important to guarantee your success. Students must be seated when the bell rings.
- Homework is due at the beginning of the period. Parents Do not bring forgotten work to the school. The office staff will <u>not</u> deliver work to students.
- Late work is generally not accepted; however, we understand on occasion, "life happens"... therefore, if an emergency arises, students should speak with the teacher and make arrangements.
- If absent: It is the student's responsibility to promptly follow their teacher's policy regarding makeup work. Per Board Policy, students have the same number of days for which they were absent to complete missing assignments. This does <u>not</u> apply to long-term projects. Work due on the day of an absence is due the day a student returns. Time will be limited for make-up tests. Students should check jupiter ed regularly as teacher may not give repeated reminders.
